COLLECT OF THE WEEK

O God, on this day You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

DID YOU KNOW?

Pentecost comes from the Greek word *Pentēkostē*, meaning “the fiftieth day.” It is celebrated 50 days after Easter Sunday and is 10 days after Christ’s Ascension. Pentecost is also called “Whitsunday” or “White Sunday.”

MONDAY — THE PSALM

Read Psalm 143

What are some of David’s characteristics toward God?

He desires to be with God and not hidden (verse 7)

David trusts in the Lord. (verse 8)

He clings to God for deliverance from his enemies (verse 9)

David relies on God to direct him. God lifts up his soul. (verse 8) Let Your good Spirit lead me. (verse 10)

TUESDAY — THE OLD TESTAMENT

Read Genesis 11:1-9

What did the people want to build? Why did they build it? (verse 4)

They wanted to make a city with a tower that would reach the heavens. They wanted to make a name for themselves. They wanted to withstand God’s wrath concerning sin. They did not believe God’s Word that He would not destroy the world again with flood waters.

What material did the people use when building?

They made bricks instead of using stone found in nature.

What is the consequence of their rebellion against God?

The Trinity (mentioned as “us” in verse 7) confused their language so that they could not understand one another’s speech and dispersed them over the face of all the earth (verse 8).

Optional Reading & Discussion Questions

Joel 2:28-32

What promise does God give in these verses?

God promises to “pour out my Spirit” to all people. The Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. It is through the Holy Spirit that the church is able to carry out the mission of spreading the Gospel.

Who is responsible for the survivors? (verse 32)

The LORD. We are chosen by His grace.

WEDNESDAY — THE GOSPEL

Read John 14:23-31

Who is the Helper and why was He sent?

The Holy Spirit is the Helper and was sent by God both the Father and the Son. He will “comfort us in all tribulation, anguish, and sorrow which we must suffer for God” and teach us “the truth: the noble, precious Word of God, the Holy Gospel, the Catechism, Table of Duties, and all that is profitable and good.” (Spangenberg, *The Christian Year of Grace*, page 219)

What event is being referenced in verse 28?

Jesus Christ’s Ascension — I am going away, I am going to the Father

THURSDAY — THE EPISTLE

Read Acts 2:1-21

Who are “they” in verse 1?

The apostles

What gift did the Holy Spirit give them in verse 4?

The Holy Spirit gave the apostles “tongues of fire,” the ability to speak in other tongues (languages) that they did not know or were fluent in.

Which lesson is quoted in verses 17-21?

Optional Old Testament — Joel 2:28-32

In the sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, what curse was over turned?

CATECHISM CONNECTION

What is the connection of The Third Article of the Creed with Explanation and Pentecost?

It is through the Holy Spirit that: “I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

What does this mean? I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.”
